PRESIDENT'S DAY FUN FACTS

President's Day is celebrated on the 3rd Monday in February thanks to the 1968 Uniform Monday Holiday Act. It was established in 1888 in honor of George Washington, whose birthday was February 22.

1. George Washington, our first president, was the first president to be featured on a postage stamp.
2. James Madison was the shortest president, standing 5 feet 4 inches tall and weighed only 100 lbs. Abraham Lincoln and Lyndon B. Johnson are tied as the tallest presidents at 6 feet 4 inches tall.
3. Theodore Roosevelt was the youngest man to hold the office of president. John F. Kennedy was the youngest to be elected to the office. Joe Biden is the oldest president at 78 years, 61 days.
4. Teddy Roosevelt was blind in one eye from an injury sustained during a boxing match.
5. John F. Kennedy was the first president to be a Boy Scout.
6. The "S" in Harry S. Truman does not stand for anything.
7. Barack Obama won a Grammy Award in 2006 for his voice on the audio book *Dreams From My Father*.
8. William Henry Harrison died 32 days after becoming president from a cold he got standing in the rain giving his inauguration speech.

1. Teachers are the #1 recipients of Valentines.
2. Chocolates didn't always mean love. Physicians used to prescribe them for a broken heart.
3. The first Valentine's Day celebration took place in Paris on February 14, 1400.
4. More than 145 million greeting cards are exchanged every year for Valentine's Day.
5. In 1847 Boston pharmacist Oliver Chase invented a machine to simplify the process of making lozenges. He then started making Necco candy wafers.
6. Now more than 8 billion conversation hearts are manufactured each year.
7. More than \$1 billion is spent in the U.S. alone on Valentine's chocolates.
8. Around the year 1850 the Cadbury company created the first box of chocolates; 10 years later they created the first heart-shaped box.
