

General Membership Update

Effective June 1, 2023

Rising inflation has hit us all. The WTBM Club is not exempt from these rising costs. The Club has experienced increased monthly expenses such as utility bills, maintenance supplies, electricity, taxes, insurance, etc. along with the decreased interest rates on savings. In an effort to make ends meet and to be good stewards of our resources, the Board voted on the following changes:

- Effective June 1, 2023, the Club rental fee will increase to \$200.00, and the required deposit will be \$200.00.
- Effective June 1, 2023, the Club rental fee for bereavement events, such as memorial receptions, celebration of life, etc., is \$100.00 for any member of our Williamsburg community, whether or not they belong to the Club.





Memorial Day, which was originally known as Decoration Day, originated after the Civil War as **a springtime tribute to fallen soldiers**. The ceremony was marked by prayer and the decorating of fallen soldiers' graves with flowers. This holiday is specifically focused on remembering those who lost their lives in defense of our country.

Some of the Memorial Day traditions include the President of the United States laying of a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery, as well as religious services, parades, and speeches across the United States; and the personal placement of flags, insignia, and flowers on the individual graves of veterans in our local cemeteries.

To ensure the continued reverence of our fallen military personnel as well as others who have given their lives for our country, in the year 2000, Congress passed **The National Moment of Remembrance Act**. This is an added way of honoring America's fallen heroes. For one minute on Memorial Day, specifically at 3:00 p.m., we are encouraged to stop everything to pay our respects to the men and women who died in service of our country, especially those who died in battle. The time of 3:00 p.m. was chosen because it's likely when Americans are most enjoying the freedom made possible by those who died in service of their country. GOD BLESS AMERICA!
